Clarence Ling
Founder and Principal, Allspice Institute

Clarence is an educational and culinary leader dedicated to cultural preservation, wellness, and community engagement. He founded the Allspice Institute (ASI) in 2008, which has become one of Southeast Asia's top culinary schools. Under his leadership, ASI has received numerous accolades, including the World Gourmet Summit Awards (2018) and Top 10 Culinary School recognition from Asia Business Outlook (2023).

Clarence's initiatives, like the "Special Tok Panjang," celebrate Southeast Asian heritage, while the ASI Heritage Cookbook preserves traditional recipes. He collaborates with organisations like the Singapore Heart Foundation, co-publishing the "Cook Right Eat Right Cookbook" in 2016, and hosting wellness events.

In community leadership, Clarence has held roles such as Vice President of the China Society (2022-2024) and District Governor for Y's Men International (2023-2024). He founded "Circle of Friends" in 2014, assisting at-risk youth through counselling and community participation.

Previously, Clarence practised law as an IP specialist (1995-2003), representing clients like Microsoft, and later ventured into the F&B sector. His commitment has earned him awards, including the Community Spirit Merit Award (2024) and multiple recognitions for cultural preservation and community engagement.

His vision is to elevate educational and sustainability standards across Asia, empowering individuals in culinary arts, heritage appreciation, and wellness.

Prof Khoo's work extends beyond Singapore, with impactful projects in Malaysia, China, India, Cambodia, Timor-Leste, and Rwanda. His designs are celebrated for their innovative approach to sustainability, biodiversity, and social responsibility. In 2020, Prof Khoo and Belinda were honoured with the prestigious President's Design Award Designer of the Year, recognising their outstanding contributions to the field.

As a thought leader, Prof Khoo has curated exhibitions at the Venice Biennale and other international platforms, showcasing Singapore's architectural prowess on the global stage. Peng-Ean Khoo read economics at the University of Cambridge and has been a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales since 1997. She trained at Pricewaterhouse in London and PricewaterhouseCoopers in Boston, gaining experience in audits, IPO preparation, and M&A support.

In 2000, Peng-Ean co-founded Bilberries Blue with her brother, aiming to support sustainable enterprises and enable economic development. She has served as a finance consultant and interim CFO for various entities, including NTUC Social Enterprises in Singapore.

Peng-Ean founded One Love Ltd in 2014, creating birth-to-lifelong support platforms to foster meaningful livelihoods and responsible access. She has led numerous initiatives, including Emergent Poetry, The Happy Heart School, and BB Studio, all focused on sustainable education and human development.

Notably, One Love completed an inclusive prototype for adolescents and young adults through Bilberries Blue LightHouse between 2021-2023. This typology for a fully inclusive live-play-work space aims to be scalability-ready by 2026.

Peng-Ean co-founded The Kind Grower in 2022 to pivot Food Forest Farm towards global food sustainability. In 2023, the Bilberries Blue ROSEhut paradigm emerged to address innovation adoption gaps, creating a sustainable rural-urban development model aligned with SDG2030 goals.

Peng-Ean's work embodies a commitment to sustainable, inclusive development across economic, social, and ecological spheres, fostering meaningful change and resilience for communities worldwide.



Dr Francis Ng
Distinguished Botanist

Dr. Francis Ng, at 85, is a renowned botanist with six decades of excellence in forestry. Graduating from St Michael's Institution in Ipoh in 1959, he holds a BSc from the University of Tasmania and a PhD from the University of Oxford. Francis joined the Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM) in 1964 and became its Deputy Director-General in 1986.

In 1991, Francis joined the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) as Chief of its Service for Forestry Research, Training, and Education. He has been pivotal in projects like the Tree Flora of Sabah and Sarawak and forest restoration in Sabah, and served as Director at CIFOR, Indonesia. In 2009, he received the David Fairchild Medal for Plant Exploration.

Francis is not just a researcher but a passionate advocate for sustainable forestry and community engagement. His collaborations with international organisations promote biodiversity and educate future generations. Francis's visionary leadership continues to inspire and drive environmental stewardship.



Dr. Gretchen Christina Coffman
Ecologist, Geographer, Educator

Dr Coffman is a distinguished wetland restoration ecologist and Senior Lecturer at the National University of Singapore. As a National Geographic Explorer, she leads the Tropical Restoration Ecology Lab, focusing on conservation biogeography and developing strategies to restore tropical ecosystems such as mangroves, rivers, and coral reefs.

Peter Ong

Biodiversity Advocate | Wildlife Photographer

Peter's journey blends passion, purpose, and impactful advocacy. Holding a Bachelor of Law from the University of Bristol and a Master's in International Business Law from the London School of Economics, he began his career in advertising with McCann-Erickson Malaysia before transitioning to the performing arts.

Inspired by a deep love for wildlife and the environment, Peter shifted to wildlife photography and conservation. In 2019, he founded Project Monyet, documenting Malaysia's 26 primate species, many of which are endangered. His initiatives empower local communities to protect their natural environments and showcase Malaysia's rich biodiversity.

Peter's achievements include the "Wang Kelian, Perlis – The Forgotten Valley" project, which highlighted a biodiverse and culturally significant region through a book and documentary. He also authored "PRIMUS – The Primates of Peninsular Malaysia," the first Asian publication featuring a foreword by Dr. Jane Goodall.

A global advocate, Peter serves on Dr. Jane Goodall's Legacy Foundation council and as Head of Outreach and Education for Roots and Shoots Malaysia. His writings and talks inspire audiences locally and globally.

Currently, Peter is documenting Malaysia's biodiversity with the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) at Sabah's Deramakot Forest. He is also revitalising the Denai Warisan (Heritage Trail) in Perlis, a historic limestone forest trail in the 130-million-year-old Nakawan Range. Peter's work celebrates Malaysia's natural heritage, fostering a sustainable future through conservation and education.



Benoit Lancelot

Co-Manager, Terra Botanica Butterfly Houses

From educating blind teenagers to becoming a leading voice in butterfly conservation, Benoit Lancelot has built his career around understanding the intricate relationship between fauna and flora. A passionate French botanist and entomology enthusiast, he spent 12 years as a gardener, guide, and educator at Terra Botanica, Europe's premier plant-themed park, before stepping up to co-manage its two Butterfly Houses.

At Terra Botanica, Benoit oversees over 110 butterfly species across the Tropical Butterflies House and the newly opened Butterfly Garden, where he champions conservation and public awareness initiatives. A disciple of renowned entomologist Jean-Pierre Vesco, he has also represented France at the 2024 IABES conference.

His expertise extends beyond borders—since 2022, he has immersed himself in Malaysia's biodiversity interning, volunteering, and collaborating with leading conservation centres such
